[46] Can a Catholic Priest Reveal the Sins I confessed to Him?

As we continue our brief catechesis on Confession in form reflection, we come to an issue that confronts so many Catholics, namely, the fear of confessing their sins to a priest. Among the reasons for this fear is concern that a priest will reveal their sins. Perhaps, this might be why many are reluctant in going for Confession. Here, I strongly recommend a powerful booklet, **CONFESSION: A LITTLE BOOK FOR THE RELUCTANT**, by Msgr Louis Gaston de Ségur. This book of 73 pages will guide you on amazing ways to prepare for confession and the confidence and consolation that the Lord pours out in this Sacrament. It shaped my spiritual life deeply!

Imagine some persons in a conversation with a priest, and the following constitute their dialog on fear or confession.

Q: Do you realize how amazing the Sacraments are except one that terrifies me?

A: Hmmm! How can every other Sacrament be amazing except one? I wonder which one is that?

Q: Confession, of course! I am afraid of telling a priest my sins. I am afraid he will reveal them?

A: Reveal them to who?

Q: That's only a fear! It's not true. (She asks the priest). Father, please we need your insight here.

A (The priest replies): Remember that a priest is only an instrument of God's forgiveness. So, he has the power to forgive sins, but has no power to reveal them? In hearing Confessions, a priest continues John the Baptist's action of pointing out Jesus as the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world (see John 1:29). If He takes away sins, then, how then can a priest call the taken away sins back? Every priest is, therefore, prohibited to expose what the Lord has forgiven because the same Lord is the Key, such that what He opens no one dares to close, and what He closes no one dares to open (see Revelations 3:7). He only gave priests the authority to bind and loose (see Matt 16:19), so that whose sins is forgiven is forgiven (see John 20:23). It is based on these principles that the Church forbids every priest from breaking the seal of the Confessional in canons 983 and 984 of the Code of Canon Law. This includes also that he cannot even use any knowledge he obtained in confession both for private and public conversations.

Q: So, you mean that by this that every penitent is protected?

A: Very true! In fact, we have several priests who have defended the seal of the confessional with their lives. One of them was St Joseph Sarkander. The seal of the confessional is like Jesus giving His life for our Redemption. This is why Jesus is our Brother. So, do not be afraid of confession! Rather, be afraid of not going for Confession! The former saves your soul, the latter damns it.
