[50] How do I make a Good Confession?

The beauty of the Sacrament of Confession is that through it, the Lord continues to form great saints in all of us. It is a hospital instituted by Christ the Good Samaritan to heal the wounds of humanity. These wounds are our sins. There, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world becomes the doctor who heals our souls. Imagine a conversation held by a group of friends:

Grandfather: I need some water. It's hot and dry in here.

Daughter (Gets a glass of water): Dad, here is your water.

Why do you still hold your Rosary every day at this age?

Grandfather: O that? The Rosary is the answer to everything that worries us, but it leads to something else which is the solution to every human problem.

Daughter: Hmmm, this is deep! I wonder what that solution is?

Grandfather: The priest can explain better.

Priest: The solution to every human problem is in a Person. His name is Jesus Christ.

Daughter: Wooooow! This is mind blowing. I wonder if you can say more.

Priest: The greatest problem of mankind is sin. Therefore, the solution to mankind's problem is forgiveness of sin. The One who brings it is Jesus by His Death. That is why Confession brings us back from the death of sin to life of grace.

Grandfather: But how does one make a good confession?

Priest: The first thing needed is faith in God who is Almighty. Each time we are guilty of sin, we need forgiveness. We must believe that God has the will and power to forgive us.

Daughter: Wonderful! Is faith sufficient for a good confession?

Priest: Faith is needed because it gives us the confidence to approach our God to forgive us. It, therefore, produces sorrow for our sins. This is called contrition. Contrition enables us to remember our sins and weep for them because sin is serious before God.

Grandfather: Is that why we learnt the Act of Faith and Act of Contrition in our Catechism as kids?

Priest: Exactly! So, faith and contrition assist us to always examine our conscience properly to remember our sins, to be sincerely sorry for them, and to make resolution to advance in life of virtues. All this put together make our confession a good one. If Jesus instituted this Sacrament after His Resurrection from the dead, then He is saying that to live in sin is to die, but to receive forgiveness of sins is to rise from death.

Grandfather: Great! I now see why St Maria Euphrasia Pelletier, says that it is human to fall but Angelic to rise.

Daughter: And St Catherine of Siena adds that it is diabolical to remain in sin with our will not ready to repent.

Priest: Wonderful! It, thus, means that without contrition, forgiveness of sins is not possible. We must be intentional in being contrite for our sins. So if we make good confessions, the confessions will end up making us good children of God.

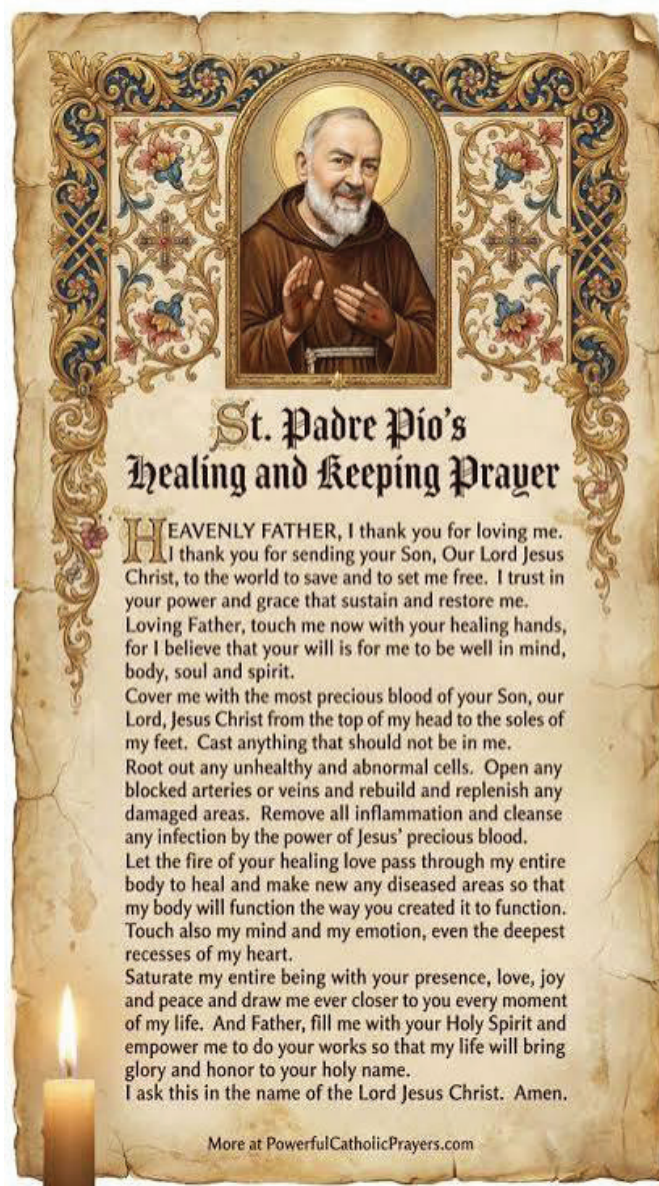
