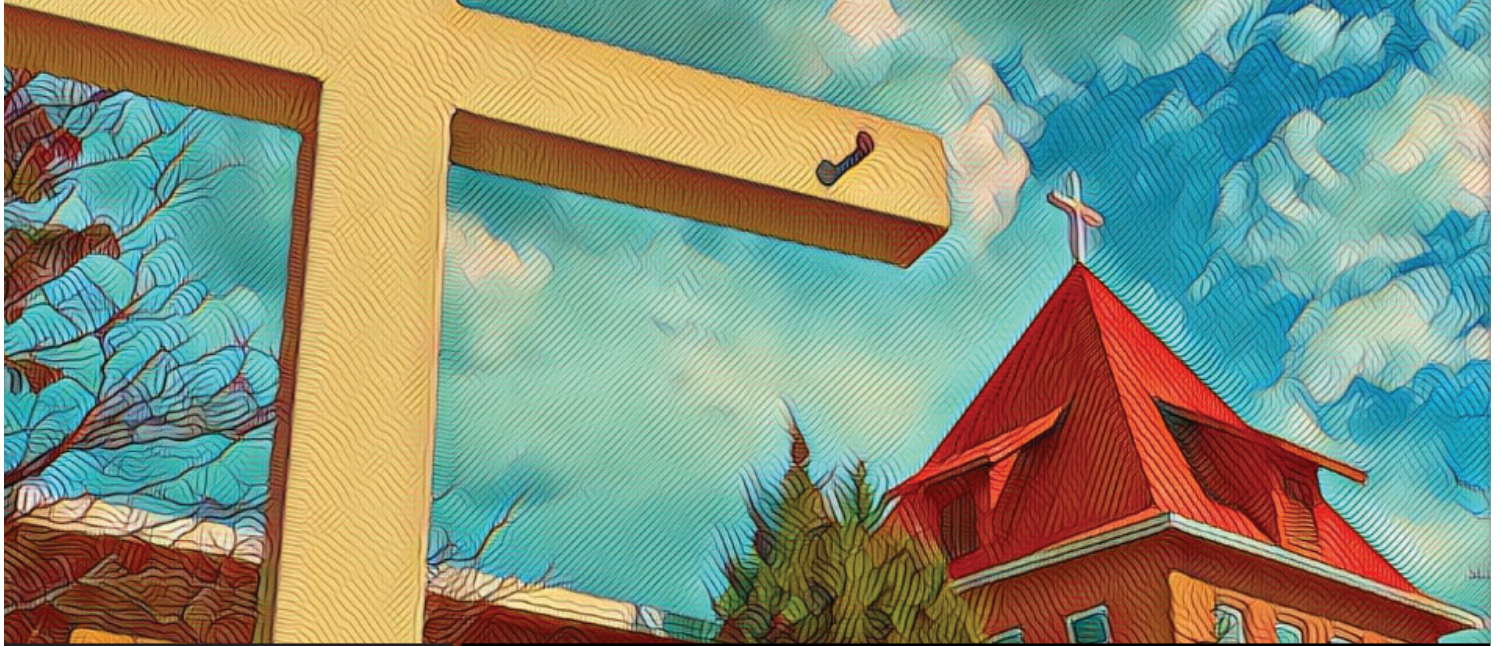

[35] How the Resurrection Triumphs over All Superstitions

Many Christians profess Resurrection in the Creed, but unfortunately, they hold several superstitions that contradict their faith like the afore-cited couple. Most times these superstitions are cultural or cultic, yet none of them is true. For example; Reincarnation focuses on the body while transmigration (otherwise called Metempsychosis) focuses on the soul. Reincarnation's main view is that humans who have died can return to life in a new body. Pythagoras, the Ancient Greek philosopher and mathematician, and his followers taught that after death, the souls of some persons continue to be purified in a new body, and sometimes such could be in animal body. For this reason, they don't eat meat. The double deficit here is countered by the Resurrection, for unlike Reincarnation which accounts for the body, but fails for the soul and Transmigration that focuses on the soul with clouded explanation on the body, the Resurrection tells us that our body and soul will reunite in a glorious way. This is our destiny.

Jesus became our brother by taking our body, died on the Cross and buried in the Tomb, yet the Easter message is that the tomb became empty (see John 20:1-9). If the tomb is empty, it means the body is no more there. But where is the body? The body has been glorified, and that is why the tomb was not Jesus' final destination. He rose from the tomb to let us know that death has died by his death, while the tomb because a pathway to the body's eternity with the soul, for in death, he sanctified all tombs. Therefore, that Empty Tomb is the Greatest Evidence of Hope. For, death means separation of the soul from the body, and the Resurrection is the eternal union of the glorified body with the soul. Our bodies have to corrupt in the tomb in order to be glorified in the new life with the soul. This is the final human destiny because if God created human being to be composite of body and soul, then the body and soul are not meant to be separated forever. Jesus our brother, with this reminds us to be mindful of what we do with our bodies here in time because it could affect our eternal joy or damnation. Jesus' body did not corrupt because He has no sin, and so, his sinlessness overturns our sinfulness in his tomb. Therefore, we must rely on Jesus as one who has conquered the tomb to help us in time to reorder the desires of our body to agree with those of the soul, so that even here and now we can have a forestate of happy resurrection in Heaven, and avoid its opposite, the painful resurrection in Hell. The choice is ours now, and the result will be soon in eternity.
