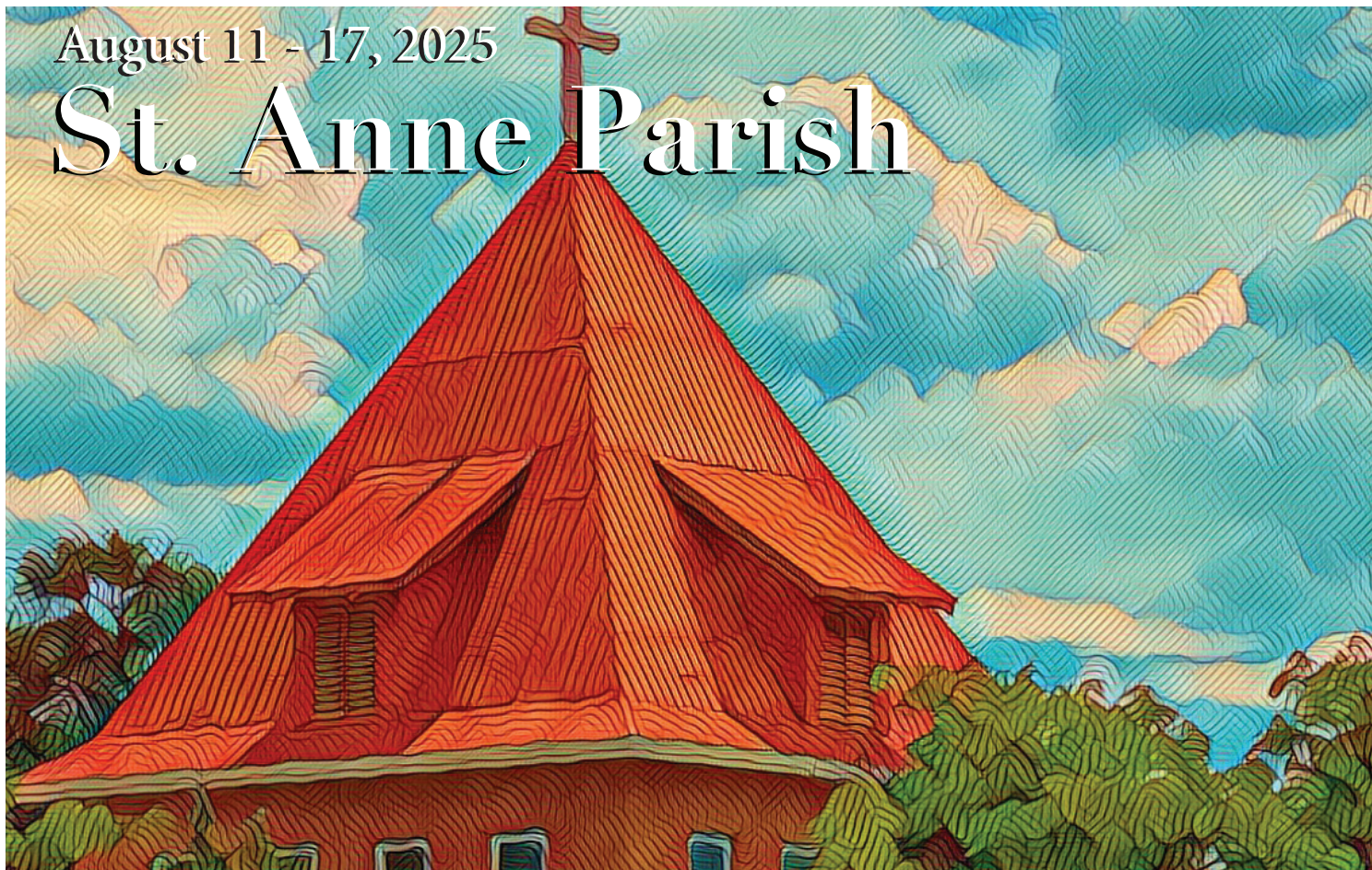

Siblings of Jesus Series

[7] Assumed to be Triumphed

In Igbo culture in Nigeria where I come from, the word for "Queen" is "Ezenwaanyi." A literal way of translating this word is "woman who reigns." From the Christian outlook, when the Church speaks of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or Mary as Queen assumed into Heaven, the "assumption" as a word here does not mean that we are not certain she was taken body and soul into Heaven, as in, that we are assuming this reality about her. We rather use that word with clear certainty of her entry into Heaven. That is why it is a proper word beginning with capital letter, hence, Assumption. This is one the principal Feasts of Our Lady made a Dogma in 1950. This Solemnity is a First-class celebration which points Mary out as hope for us about eternal destination. It reveals something about Her connection with Jesus. If Jesus was conceived and born by Mary by His divine choice, then it is His choice that as He ascended into Heaven, so will His Mother who gave Him flesh be assumed into Heaven to reign with Him, not as God, for she is not God, but as Queen. If we can apply the language used in soccer, Mary in scoring the goal of attaining Heaven by her profound sanctity, has scored a hat trick of the title of Queen, Virgin and Mother. These three titles predominantly decorate her in the Litany of Loreto. Assumption is the story God tells about His Mother, but also a story He tells about each of us. What story is this? It is the story how we use our bodies here on earth determine how we shall be rewarded in eternity, and that if like Jesus our Brother, Mary our Mother lived a life of chastity, then we shall gain abundant merits in Heaven where we shall reign forever over sin. Therefore, while in Ascension we see our Brother Jesus enthroned to mediate between us and God, in the Assumption we see our Mother enthroned to intercede for us constantly. The Assumption, which is the fifth Glorious mystery becomes the reward of the Annunciation which is the first Joyful mystery. For as Mary in the Annunciation gives Jesus flesh, in the Assumption, Jesus dignifies, sanctifies, and glorifies that flesh which enabled Him to become a man. This is why St Alphonsus Liguori exclaimed to her in a song to "Look down O Mother Mary, from thy bright throne above, cast down upon your children, but only one glance of love." Her Assumption is a consolation that one day we shall triumph over sin and death forever like her.
