29] How to Treat Workers with Respect

A young boy got employed in a cement factory. He distinguished himself as diligent man with honesty. However, unfortunately, the manager was maltreating him without mercy. Sometimes he wouldn't pay him on time. Some other times, he wouldn't pay him his full salary. Most times, he talks down to him and did many other unpleasant things to him. Yet in all these, the boy said nothing in reply and never reacted with anger. His usual response was: "I am your unworthy servant. Your word is my command sir." One day, a meeting was called by the owner of the factory. Surprising to everyone, he announced that he made a will. To everyone's shock, he willed the factory as well as entrusted its governance to the boy and told him that he found out that the latter's dad who died when his mom was still pregnant of him, was the person that made him who he was. So, willing the factory to his son is a way of paying back. Immediately, the manager who had been maltreating him burst into tears. What do you think the boy did in return to him? Would you demote or sack him if you were in his position?

The sorrowful part of the above story recycles itself in many places of work in our world today. Many employers or those with authority over other employees do not treat them with respect. Many workers are denied of their wages or half paid. Many of them aren't paid on time. Many are underpaid. Many do not receive consistent payments but rather paid at the discretion of the ones in charge. Many even have their salaries or wages and allowances embezzled by their bosses. Many of them are insulted and maltreated without respect. Many are abused verbally, mentally, emotionally, physically, and otherwise. What does all this mean? It means that human wickedness has triumphed over human sympathy. Such has led workers to develop mental illnesses and, in some cases, led to depression and suicide.

When people are maltreated in their works, their dignity as human persons and dignity of their human labor are trampled upon. Such is against the mind of the Lord who instructs that the laborer deserves his wages (see Luke 10:7). If He cautions us through the mouthpiece of St Paul, that it is only the one who does not work that should not eat (see 2 Thess 3:10), why then are those who work hard deprived of the fruits of their hard work and treated as sub-humans by their fellow humans? As siblings of Jesus, we must make restitutions for all the times we maltreated those under us and make reparations for all the damages we have done to them. For to work is participation in creation which itself is the first work done by God. Pope Leo XIII warns about this in his "Rerum Novarum," which defends dignity of workers. Such workers need healing, and may we be instruments of their healing.
