[31] Every Porn Addict is a Potential Saint

There was a young lady known for indecent appearances and leading young girls in immodest dances. Unfortunately, such way of grooming them was leading them astray. One day, the Bishop of the locality where she was, invited her and respectfully advised her to change her way of life, for such lifestyle which was public made them notorious. He made her to understand that her salvation and those of the young girls were at stake. She internalized his advice and later amended her life and discontinued gathering with the girls. She led the rest of her life in penance and mortification. That former notorious woman is today famously known as St Pelagia the Penitent. Today, we don't venerate her for her previous life of impurity, but for her life of heroic sanctity.

Many people in our world are struggling with life of impurity, especially with pornography addictions. Many have been classically conditioned that such habit has left them without hope. Many recourse to such as a remedy for frustration, yet instead of bringing remedy, it leads them to further frustrations. The side and after effect of watching porn is swimming in the ocean of masturbation - a mortal sin leading to another mortal sin. The pleasure porn seems to bring is but lustful, and in being lustful, it becomes sinful. In being sinful, it constitutes "mystery of iniquity" in the words of Pope St John Paul II. Porn has trapped both young and old, men and women, rich and poor. It respects no one's status, for even many life giants are slaves to it. But it is one thing to be addicted to it, and it is another to quit such. For one who does not want to quit, it's terrible news, for it continues to destroy him or her. But for one who wants to quit, there is good news! What's the good news?

The Good News is Jesus Christ our Brother! He is the one and only solution to such addiction. His Passion and Resurrection which the Lenten and Easter Seasons celebrate is the remedy. He is the One who tells us that blessed are the pure in spirit for they shall see God (Matt 5:8), just as He says: "This is My Body" (Matt 26:26). He means also that our Body also belongs to Him because He created it during Creation, suffered for it by His Passion, and redeemed it by His Resurrection. Therefore, He invites anyone tormented by porn habit to meditate constantly and consistently on His Passion and Suffering like Pelagia and gradually regain freedom. For as we invoke Him in the Litany of the Holy Name of Jesus, He is the One who delivers us from every spirit of fornication or uncleanness. It takes a gradual process to replace such habit with a new one. It requires patience and focus on the process and not immediately on the result just as it took a process to form the sinful habit. Make the effort to look onto the crucified Jesus, and He will do the rest. The disordered appetite brought by the pornographic inclination can be reordered to holy appetite by the Lord. Therefore, the sanctity of every porn addict is possible when and only when such a person reaches out to Jesus. He is the only One that can set you free. Don't lose hope but hold onto Jesus. If Pelagia made it, then you can make it, because you carry the smell of Christ inside you.

### FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

### ABSTINENCE

INTERESTING NOTE:  
Canon 1250 names Fridays all year long as penitential days which should be marked by some sort of sacrifice and penance. While abstinence from meat is a traditional sacrifice, Canon 1253 leaves the decision for the particular sacrifice up to the local conference of Bishops. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has obtained permission from the Holy See for Catholics in the USA to substitute a different penitential, or even a charitable, practice for abstinence from meat during the year, if they so choose.  
Abstinence from meat is obligatory during Lent everywhere.

## WHO

**CATHOLICS 14+**  
**ARE OBLIGED TO PRACTICE ABSTINENCE**

**CATHOLICS 18-58**  
**ARE OBLIGED TO FAST**

**THOSE OUTSIDE THE AGE LIMITS**  
and those whose state in life (e.g. pregnant women, manual laborers, those who are ill) may be excused from the requirements of fasting and abstinence, but are encouraged to take up some other form of penitence or acts of charity or piety.

## PLEASE NOTE

These guidelines are the minimum requirements for Lenten sacrifices. All are encouraged to impose some sort of personal penance or act of charity or piety on top of these minimums.

You could increase the number of days you practice fasting and/or abstinence, or abstain from a favorite food or activity for all of Lent. You could add things, such as committing to read the Bible for 20 minutes a day.

As in all things, Lenten penance and mortification calls for prudence.

It is wise to consult your spiritual director before undertaking additional Lenten practices.
