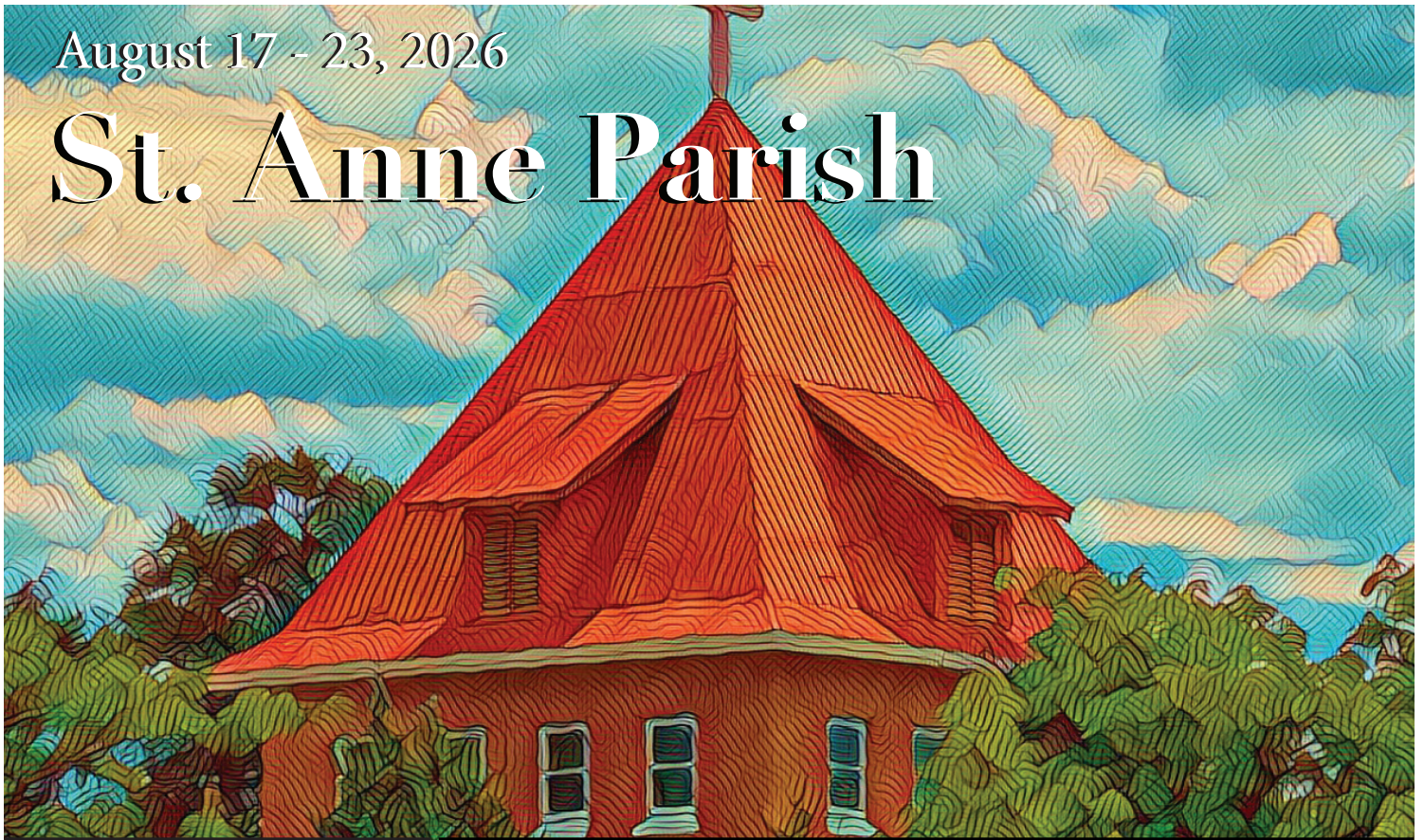

Siblings of Jesus Series

[49] When I recall the Memory of my Past Sins, Does it mean they are not forgiven?

Girl: Hi Father! Happy Sunday!

Boy: Greetings, Father! You look good today!

Priest: Hey my friends! Yes, I am smiling because the sun is smiling on us! You all look great!

Mom: Yes, my son and daughter are the best cheerful people I know.

Dad (cuts in...): Are you saying they are cheerful while I am mean?

Mom: Are you for real?

Dad: You are the one that is for fake.

Girl: Lol, dad and mom, please stop!

All bursting into laughter.

Boy: Mom says I look cheerful, but inside me, I am deeply tormented.

Priest: Tormented by what?

Boy: By my past sins. I went for a sincere confession, but the memories of my past keep coming up. I'm sometimes scared that God did not forgive me.

Priest: The other day you went to see your doctor for that monor surgery. You told me that he said you have totally recovered, but that the marks will still be there, but they won't do anything to you.

Boy: That's correct, Father.

Priest: That's the same thing with your confessed sins. The priest is a spiritual doctor. The sins are sustained injuries and wounds. Absolution given in confession is the healing. The virtues practised are the medications. The memory are the marks from the injuries. The way the physical marks in your body doesn't mean you aren't healed, that's how the memory of sins confessed sins doesn't mean they aren't forgiven.

Girl: uhmm! That's awesome.

Priest: Our memory is a natural faculty that stores our history. When they remind you of your past sins, remind yourself that your confession was sincere and that you believe in forgiveness of sins as you say in the Creed. God will not bring your forgiven sins on your Judgment Day because He doesn't keep memory of our sins. If He did, no one would survive. Yet He is full of mercy (see Psalm 130:6).

Mom: The Devil could also take advantage of this if you worry too much on past sins.

Priest: Yes, you are right. I, therefore, recommend two ways of dealing with memory. On the natural level, when your past forgiven sins come to mind, do what St Alphonsus Liguori advises: place yourself before the Mercy of God.

Dad: Wonderful. What's the second one?

Priest: Secondly, when the devil tempts you by reminding you of your past, St Teresa of Ávila says you should remind him of his future. In all, remain prayerful. God consoles us more in prayer.
