

[30] Why You Need Humor

There is a happy priest I have known for a very long time. It was from a retreat he preached that I knew about St Alphonsus Liguori, whom I am very devoted to. It was also through the same priest that I knew of the masterpiece by St Francis de Sales, “*An Introduction to the Devout Life*,” a book he gave me. This priest had a late vocation. One day when he was narrating his journey to the priesthood, he said that since God called him in an advanced age, the difference between him and his classmates is that while they were ordained as “Rev Father,” he was ordained as “Rev Grandfather.” He would tell this repeatedly to make people laugh. But the message he passes across is that no achievement we make in this life is late because God is the One in charge of time.

The above story contains so many things to be unpacked, but one of the most important of them is that we must carve out time to crack jokes, to have fun and to laugh. In a word, humor is what must not be lacking in our lives. So many people lead their lives devoid of anything laughter. Many people go to school, work, church, shopping etc. with frowning faces. Many torment themselves with worries. Many are too hard on themselves because of a past mistake. The list continues. It is one thing to joke or listen to jokes, and it is another to joke excessively. Yet it is something different not to be involved at all with funny jokes. Humor is a gift from God, a gift that must not be resisted. Even the Saints, our heavenly siblings with Jesus joked. In fact, three of them are patrons of comedians: St. Lawrence, St Gennadius and St Philip Neri.

In my culture of origin, Igbo, we have a proverb that says: “*When we joke, that is when we say the truth.*” When friends hang around to exchange sentiments of humor, life which looks difficult becomes easy and bearable. If Jesus is man in everything except in sin, then imagine what it would look like to play and joke with His mother, His disciples, and friends. Think of what he might have told Lazarus years after about calling him out from the tomb, or to Peter about his sinking into water, or to Zaccheus about his climbing of the tree. Perhaps he asked Zaccheus how many fruits of sycamore he ate while waiting for Him to pass. It is possible that our Lord’s sense of humor converted many people to be His followers. Humor is divine as well as human. Only morally permissible jokes are to be cracked. Any joke that is immoral or offends God and neighbors must be avoided for such could be blasphemy and calumny, respectively. Anyone who finds it difficult to receive humor needs to be open to it, to see the other side of life. As sadness is a tumor, life receives joy from humor. Give it a try. You will be amazed. Don’t not be hard on yourself anymore but give laughter a chance. It won’t disappoint you.
