Siblings of Jesus Series

[17] What are the Saints doing in Heaven?

When we celebrate the Feast of All Saints every November 1, it is not about only canonized saints, but of every human who is in Heaven. Canonization which only began in 997 AD with St Ulrich of Augsburg, (in Germany the first canonized saint) is celebration of a few persons in Heaven whose lives are presented to us. This means that Heaven both predates and postdates Canonization. All Saints, thus, refer to everyone who is in Heaven. Our family members, loved ones and friends who died in peace of soul are hopefully there too. But this great Solemnity compels and propels us to pause and ask the questions: what are these people doing in Heaven? What is happening there? These are important questions, for since making it to Heaven is the best honor any human can attain in his or her life, what happens there for all eternity should motivate us to make this great effort to be there. For no matter what we achieve in this life, if we don't make Heaven at the end, all is wasted. As St Alphonsus Liguori says, once a soul is saved, all about him is saved and is saved forever, while once if it is lost, all about him is lost and lost forever (see Sermon XLIII).

We are informed in the Scriptures that those in Heaven see God face to face and His name will be written on their foreheads (see Rev 22:4). The face-to-face language echoes a word in my native language, Igbo, 'Ifunanya' which means "to see with the eyes" which means Love. In Heaven, the Saints are doing the same thing Jesus was doing on the Cross because what He did on the Cross is to bring us to Heaven. On the Cross, God loves man. In

Heaven, men, that is, Saints are loving God. Their eternal act of love comes from God's love on the Cross.

For having found the Cross as ladder to Heaven - of Divine Ascent (borrowing the title of desert monk, John Climacus' book) because it was first ladder of Divine descent from where God comes to save mankind, Heaven becomes the place where those saved by that Cross love without end their Savior, Jesus, who brings them into communion with the Father and the Holy Spirit. This eternal love of Saints toward God becomes the basis for their powerful intercessions for us. Apart from Mary and John the Baptist who were born without sin, every saint was a converted sinner. By their conversion Jesus changes them into saints and makes them our intercessors. For this reason, they become eternal siblings of Jesus.

If Saints see and love God face to face, they can also talk to Him face to face on our behalf. This is prayer! This is Beatific Vision! Reginald Garrigou-Lagrange, OP, in his book, "Life Everlasting," calls the former essential Beatitude, and the latter accidental Beatitude. For there, faith is replaced with vision of God, hope is replaced with possession of the same God, but love of God remains (see chap XXX). The Saints are not harmful, but friendly. Let their lives console us that we can become one of them. As St John Vianney teaches, Saints are those who didn't begin well, but ended their lives well, and this should be our aim too (see The Little Catechism of the Cure of Ars, part 1, chap 1). Choose a patron saint today. Ask them to also pray for souls in purgatory whom we celebrate on November 2, a day after theirs. May they pray for us. Even you who read this, no matter how far away you think you are from God, He sees you as a potential saint because we all are all siblings of Jesus His Son who teaches us to call Him Our Father.
