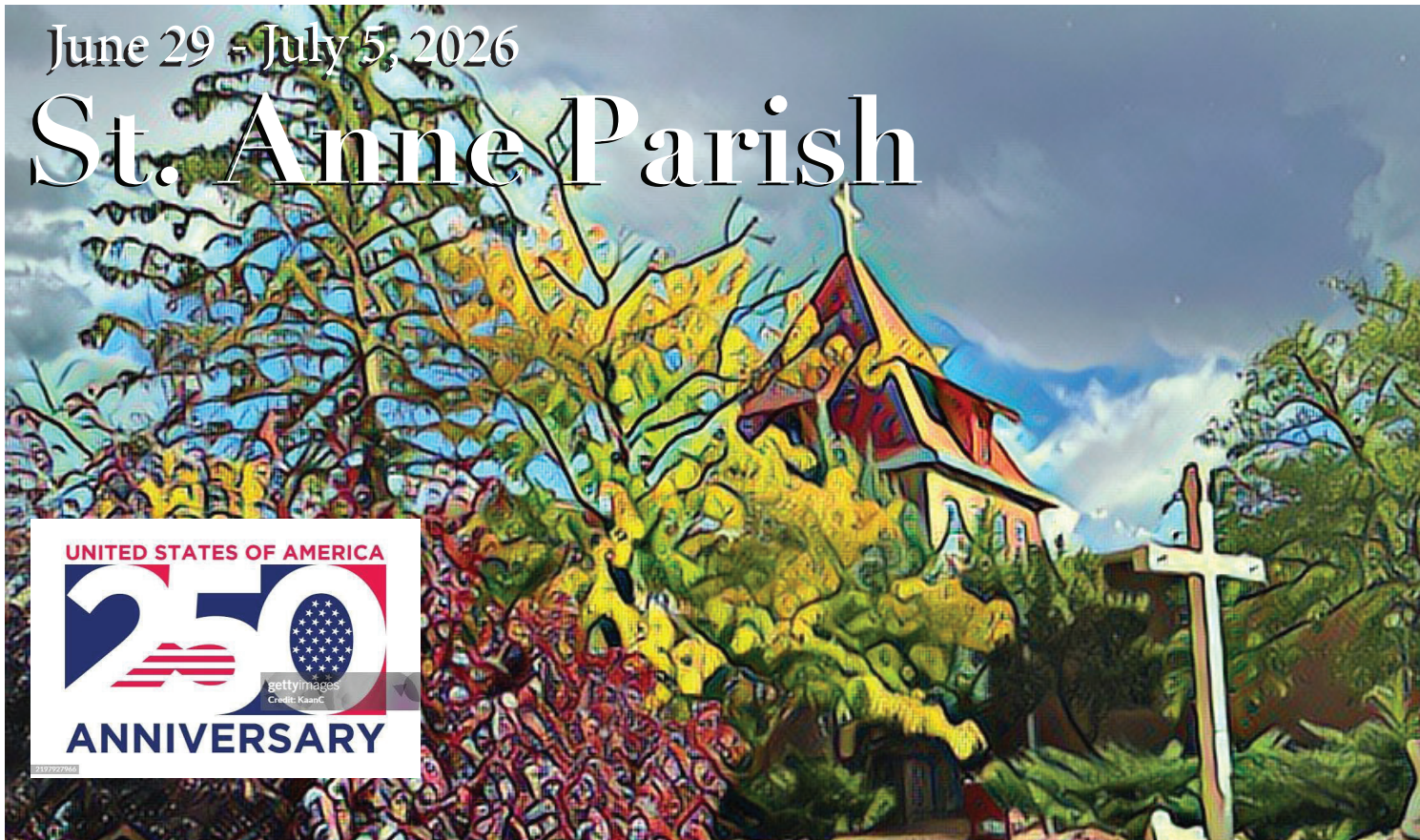

[45] Why Must I Confess My Sins to a Priest?

In the present and subsequent series, we shall be focusing for some time on various misunderstandings people - both Catholics and non-Catholics have about the Sacrament of Confession, which often leave them confused and away from it. In them, we shall briefly articulate such notions in form of question and answer, or dialog. I hope that this will help us learn, unlearn, and re-learn several things about this Sacrament of great hope, healing, and consolation. For Confession is a vehicle built by God in Heaven, and Jesus is the Driver who carries us in this life which is the highway to the same Heaven. Hopefully, this would provide simple catechesis.

Q: Why should I confess my sins to a priest?

A: To understand the reason, it is important to understand who a priest is.

Q: Who then is a priest?

A: A priest is a man ordained by God through the hands of a Bishop. Ordination sets him aside as one dedicated to God. The word for priest in Latin, "sacerdos", and it means "sacra" (sacred) and "dare" (to give). A priest is a giver of what is sacred. What is sacred is from God. So, God gives a priest the power to do many things, such that God is the Agent while the priest is His instrument.

Q: Does it then mean that I should confess to a Priest because He has the power to forgive sins?

A: That is the truth. Jesus gave His power to His Apostles after He rose from the dead and told them that whose sins they forgive is forgiven, and whose sins they retain is retained (see John 20:21:23). The ordination of every Catholic priest is traceable to the Apostles. To live in sin is to be spiritually dead. So, in giving this power to forgive sins after He rose from the dead, Jesus tells us that it is through confession that our souls dead in sin returns to the life of grace which is the life of God. Therefore, if people can go to a priest to receive blessing when they are in need, or to baptize them or their babies, or to anoint them when they are sick, or to consecrate the Eucharist, or to witness their marriages, why then should they not go to a priest to receive forgiveness for their sins? Jesus our Brother by giving us this Sacrament of Confession in the ministry of priests encourages us to be humble. It is only humility that can make us accept confession as a gift. It is only humble souls that can go for confession. God identifies with the humble and meek.
