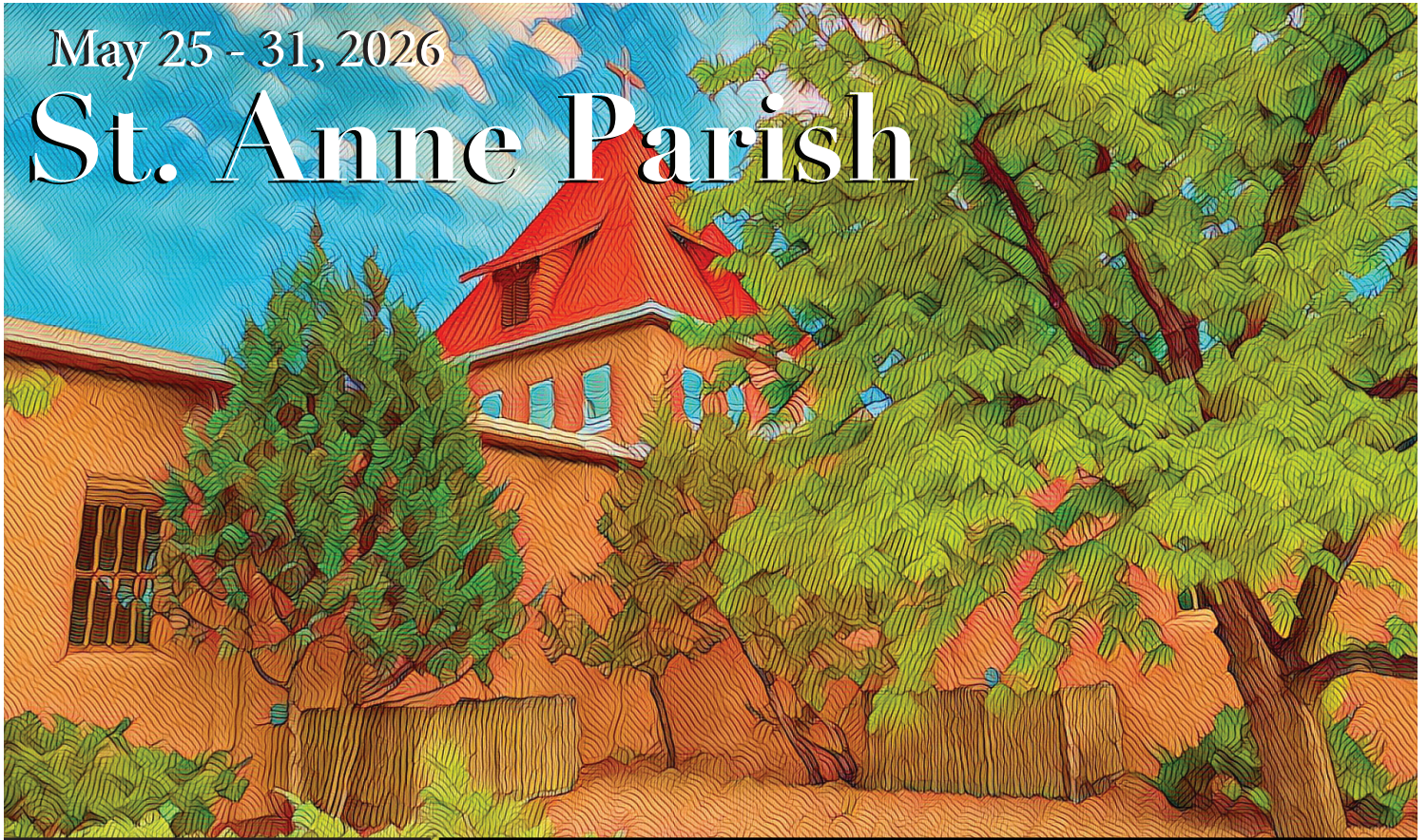

[40] How Does the Holy Spirit Help Us?

In the summer of 2023, I spent three weeks studying for a Diploma in Mysticism at the Universidad de Santa Teresa de Jesús (UCAV), in Ávila, Spain. This summer program which focused on the mysticism of St John of the Cross and St Teresa of Ávila, is one of the greatest things I am grateful to God for, it changed and deepened the way I pray due to my new understanding on the role of the Holy Spirit in our inner life. One highlight of that program was my visitations to the Monastery of the Incarnation where St Teresa had lived where also St John of the Cross served as the confessor for the Carmelite nuns for around 7 years. That monastery has produced many saints. My favorite places there are the chapel where she experienced the Transverberation (An Angel piercing her heart) and the parlor where she received visitors.

On one Trinity Sunday, while Teresa was talking with John on the parlor, someone saw them suspended in the air, a mystical phenomenon known as levitation. St John of the Cross calls the Holy Spirit the “Living Flame of Love that tenderly wounds the soul in its deepest center.” He says that He is “not oppressive,” but rather “consummate.” This means that the Holy Spirit is alive and He gives us interior light when everything becomes dark. That’s why Jesus our Lord and Brother says that blessed are those who mourn “for they shall be comforted” (see Matt 5:4). The term used in the Greek text for that statement is “paraklethesontai,” passing the idea that while consolation is something we need to receive in times of desolation, it belongs to the Holy Spirit to give it to us.

Therefore, if Pentecost is the outpouring of this Divine Spirit, it means He is our special Friend. The purpose of pouring Himself “out” is to find His dwelling “in” us. John’s reference to Him as “flame” also shows that as fire, He burns and destroys our sins and ignites our soul with love for virtues. Hence, the name Ignatius, from Latin, ‘ignis,’ meaning ‘fire’ derives from the Holy Spirit. He is not harmful but rather gentle by giving us consolation. He is not stingy but rather generous with His 7 Gifts and 12 Fruits. He is not terrible but rather peaceful by His gentle touch and joy. He wants to console, comfort, help, and heal you. What is that one thing that has been tormenting you for a long time? Pray to Him today saying: “Come O Holy Spirit and fill the heart of Thy faithful. And enkindle in me the fire of Thy love.”
